'Be kind and compassionate to one another, forgiving each other, just as in Christ God forgave you.' (Ephesians 4:32)


What is the keystone?

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What are our academy's values?

CURRICULUV

Our curriculum is broad, balanced and intellectually fulfilling. Our core subjects work alongside a wider range of subjects, which together showcase individual passions and talents and align with students' future education and career goals.

Meeting individual requirements is essential for progress and success. Our curriculum team carefully consider the needs of all students and create an environment that nurtures ability and supports improvement.

We place a strong emphasis on literacy and numeracy to ensure our students leave with the key skills valued by employers and educational establishments. Moving into key stage 4 and 5, students are supported in choosing the most appropriate courses to match their onward aspirations.

Throughout each student's time at National, they are set challenging targets to aim for. We track the attainment and progress individuals are making against these goals, and feed back to students and their families. Our robust approach to information, advice and guidance also ensures that students feel supported during their studies.

SUPPORT & SHOW RESPECT FOR EVERYONE GUIDANCE

We have a dedicated support system in school which covers pastoral care, assistance for special educational needs and disabilities, and mental health and emotional wellbeing.

Our pastoral system is organised into tutor groups, each with their own dedicated tutor who they will see each day, and a Head of Year. Tutor groups provide peer support, guidance and friendship.

We support students with a wide range of additional needs through our Inclusion team. Expert staff led by our SENCO work closely with students to support their individual educational and emotional needs, together with responding to any behavioural difficulties in a positive manner.



We offer a wealth of enrichment and extra-curricular activities outside of the main school timetable. These give students a chance to express themselves, try something new or nurture existing interests and talents. These activities range from sporting to creative, to clubs and societies, and social action groups.

There are opportunities for local and national visits as well as some international residential trips. These help to put learning into context and skills into practise.

Community involvement is also very important and emphasises our core values to students and the Hucknall community.

Our Careers Information, Education, Advice and Guidance leader ensures that students develop an understanding of the world of work and gain vital experience.

Equality, diversity and Inclusion sit at the heart of our academy, ensuring all students are celebrated for who they are as well as their achievements.
